- It encompasses 13,667 islands (some sources say as many as 18,000), only 6,000 of which are inhabited.

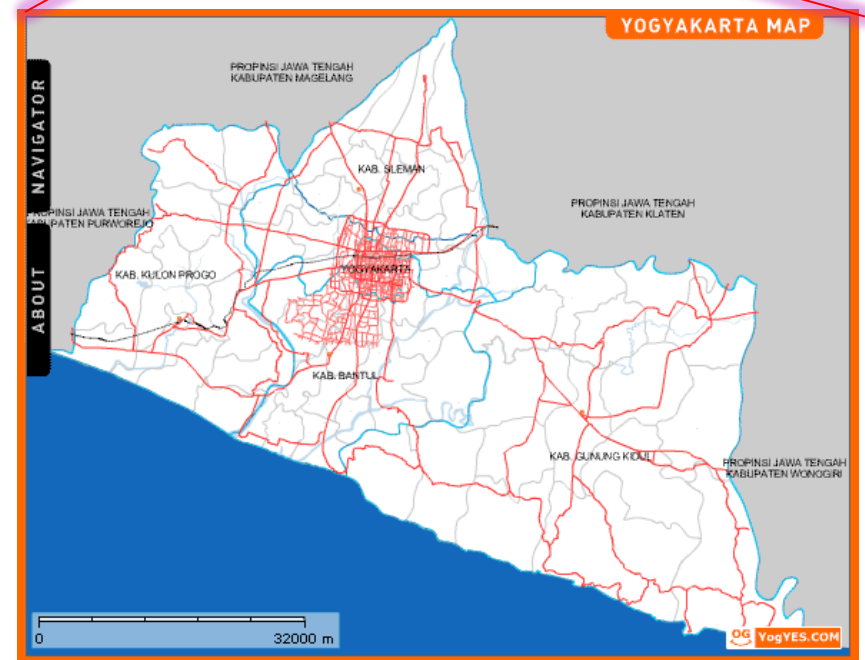
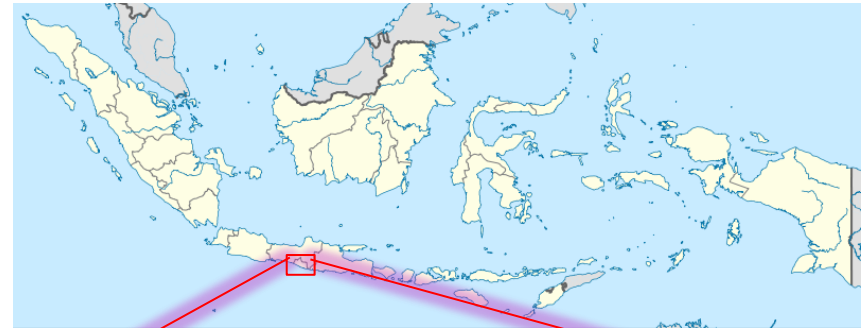
Indonesia



- There are five main islands (Sumatra, Java, Kalimantan, Sulawesi, and Irian Jaya), two major archipelagos (Nusa Tenggara and the Maluku Islands), and sixty smaller archipelagos
- No less than 669 languages, but only one national language, Indonesia Language

Yogyakarta region

- The Special Region of Yogyakarta on the island of Java is the smallest province of Indonesia
- The population in 2010 was estimated at 3,452,390. It has an area of 3,185.80 km²
